They present selected research methods, use them in the search for new research and work procedures and important interactive system links. The graduate is characterized by independent and analytical thinking which they apply in changing conditions. They take into account scientific, ethical and social aspects when formulating research objectives and interpreting research results. They are characterized by a high degree of independence, originality, initiative, responsibility, innovative, critical and creative thinking. They independently present the results of research and development in front of the professional community in the Slovak Republic and abroad. Employers are represented in the Programme Board for the study programme of nursing participating in the preparation and adjustments of the study programme curriculum and study programme quality evaluation system with a periodicity of 1 x per academic year. The Programme Board has issued a positive opinion on the proposal for harmonizing the study programme. Employers will participate in the evaluation of graduates. At the same time, their representatives participate in the preparation and adjustments of the study programme curriculum within the Council of Study. Employers are represented in the faculty Quality Council and the Council for the Internal Quality Assurance System of SMU. The faculty will begin regular evaluation of the study programme through feedback using the questionnaire method in the academic year 2022/2023.</p>

The faculty announces the dates of the admission procedure for doctoral studies and lists the topics of final theses and supervisors of these theses on the faculty's official bulletin board and on the faculty website no later than 60 days before the last day of application submission. The application is submitted electronically in the prescribed SMU form (generated by the MAIS electronic system). The applicant is obliged to deliver the printed application with attachments to the office of the SMU or by mail to the address of the Dean's Office. Mandatory attachments to the application for doctoral studies are: notarized diploma copies of higher education of II. degree achieved in the nursing

	<p>study programme (or other qualification documents) and the addendum to the diploma if it forms its annex and the certificate of the state examination, a professional CV (Europass format) including telephone and e-mail contact, an overview of published works and other activities highlighting the professional profile of the applicant, a certified copy on passing the state exam in a world language, the one about the achieved minimum level of B2 assessment of language skills according to the Common European Reference Framework (if the applicant has one), if the applicant does not have such a document on the day of the entrance exam, they also take an entrance exam in English or German, the name of chosen topic of dissertation which they apply for and elaborated theses of project in writing, receipt of payment of the administrative fee for the admission procedure.</p> <p>Requirements for admission to doctoral studies: completed higher education studies of II. degree in the field of nursing according to a special regulation including acquired rights (Government Regulation No. 296/2010 Coll. on professional competence for the performance of the medical profession), the system of specialized fields and the system of certified work activities as amended by the later regulations wording of rights. In the case of applicants who have received their education abroad, necessary documentation of a document on the recognition of education according to § 7 of Act No. 422/2015 Coll. on the recognition of documents on education and on the recognition of professional qualifications and on the amendment of certain acts, b) successful completion of the entrance exam. The entrance exam is held in front of the committee, it consists of a professional exam, professional discussion on the topic and basic theses of dissertation, the entrance exam in a world language (English or German) if the applicant does not submit documents about passing the state exam in a world language. When determining the order, the admissions committee takes into account the quality of the final thesis project, also takes into account the scope and quality of the applicant's professional publication activity and the results of their other professional activity, (e.g. results in SSPA, student scientific professional activity, competitions, foreign study stays and post-graduate internships, participation in projects, etc.) . Based on the evaluation of individual candidates for doctoral studies, the admissions committee determines the order of their success. The dean of the faculty decides on the acceptance or rejection of the applicant based on the proposal of the admissions committee, when deciding on the number of admitted applicants for full-time doctoral studies, they take into account the approved number of places for the given academic year.</p>
