Test rating in percentages: A: 100 % - 94 %, B: 93 % - 89 %, C: 88 % - 83 %, D: 82 % - 77 %, E: 76 % - 70 %, Fx: 69 % and less. Student workload is 22 hours. Indirect workload consists of individual preparation for practicals based on recommended study materials.

Student will be able to perform clinical interviews, mental status examinations and a physical examination. Student is able to use selected psychiatric rating scales. Psychopathological syndromology.</i> <i>Classification of mental disorders.</i> <i>Complex treatment in Psychiatry (pharmacotherapy, psychotherapy, rehabilitation, resocialisation).</i> <i>Training in clinical interviews, mental state examination.</i> <i>Organization of psychiatric care. Legal and ethical issues in psychiatry.</i> <i>Social and transcultural psychiatry.</i> <i>Pediatric Psychiatry (selected mental disorders in child and adolescent) 6/0.</i>
