Learning results: <i>The graduate knows how to complete knowledge about surgical diseases, can deepen practical skills in the principles of surgical propaedeutics, knows the principles of daily care of the surgical patient. He knows the principles of work in the surgical outpatient clinic and operating room. He can apply the above knowledge to other surgical departments / orthopedics, traumatology, urology, plastic surgery, neurosurgery, pediatric surgery, anesthesiology and intensive care medicine /.</i>											
Brief content of the course (syllabus): <i>State exam - consists of a practical exam (patient's medical record) and a theoretical exam. The practical part consists of a complete examination of the patient and processing of the medical record, which contains (taking anamnesis, objective examination, differential diagnosis, examination design, treatment design). Theoretical part of the state exam: is performed at the relevant specialist clinic before the state final examination commissions. The student draws 3 questions from the designated areas. After answering all the questions and taking into account the result of the practical test, the commission will recommend the overall evaluation to the chairman of the commission.</i>
